ACM Lifting Lives Music Camp is a weeklong residential camp held in Nashville, Tennessee. The camp is designed for youth and adults with a passion for music. Campers participate in a songwriting workshop, a recording session, a songwriter's night, and a live performance at the Grand Ole Opry. The camp also focuses on social skills and independence and has a research component.

Eligible Participants

- Diagnosed with Williams syndrome
- Minimum age: 18 years (no maximum age)
- Verbal and able to respond to directions

- Possesses musical ability (comfortable and willing to sing)
- Able to stay away from home for a week
- Relatively independent with no aggressive behaviors or wandering away
- Must be medically able to handle the demands of camp
